The nurse practitioner will manage primary healthcare needs for pediatrics and adults. These services will include, but are not limited to, health promotion and risk reduction, emotional and developmental evaluation, consultation and referrals. Patients will be seen in the office

  Primary Supervising Physician Name:

The physician consulted will depend on who is available in the office. Consultation will be from person to person or via telephone. If there is a life threatening emergency or situation which exceeds the APRN scope of practice, the patient will be seen by the primary or supporting supervising physicians. In the event of a life-threatening emergency, the APRN will initiate CPR and call 911 for EMS services.

f. <u>Consultations with Supervising Physicians</u> (description of how consultation with the physician is provided for back up consultations in the physician's absence)

The primary supervising physician and the backup supervising physician are used for consultation, face to face or via telephone at all times.

### II. Medical Guidelines for Clinical Practice

The APRN must have completed the approved education and training according to South Carolina law and must hold a valid South Carolina nursing license to practice. The APRN will function under the guidelines of this protocol.

- a. Specific clinical duties will include initial and follow-up history and physicals, progress and discharge notes, documenting information in the medical records, ordering and interpreting diagnostic procedures and lab tests, ordering and writing prescriptions for appropriate medications.
- b. The APRN is obligated to practice within standards and scope of practice set forth by the State Board of Nursing and professional organizations.
- c. Medical conditions for which treatment / therapies may be initiated, continued, or modified would include, but not limited to, family planning counseling, wellness issues, health promotion, education and management of acute and chronic health problems, growth, and development.
- d. Treatment / Interventions that may be initiated, continued, or modified:
  - i. Obtain history and perform medical examination of patients
  - ii. Assess subjective and objective patient data
  - iii. Order diagnostic data including, but not limited to, laboratory tests, EKG, X-rays, MRI's, CT's, and pulmonary function tests
  - iv. Document findings in patient's medical records
  - v. Education, including but not limited to, healthcare needs and interventions, health promotion, safety, developmental milestones, and medications
  - vi. Evaluate patient responses to disease processes and therapeutic interventions to assess effectiveness of care
  - vii. Consult with other community services and agencies, including but not limited to, medical specialists, nurse practitioners, physical therapists, occupational therapists, respiratory therapists, rehabilitation services, social services, home health, hospice, mental health, psychological counseling, law enforcement, or other specialized services.
  - viii. Maintain current records for all patient encounters

The APRN will practice under the supervision / collaboration of the physicians from HopeHealth, Inc. These protocols serve as guidelines and are not all-inclusive. Protocols may be expanded and revised as necessary. The nurse practitioner may render care for medical conditions not included within these protocols with the consultation of the physicians. A physician will be available to the APRN at all times.
